Passing of a Lion: Daniel Dircksen By Lion John Dorn:

On July 16th, the Bellbrook Lions Club lost a very important and dear friend. Dan Dircksen lost his two-year battle with cancer. He was a valuable Lion's Club member for over 30 years.

As a Lion, Dan was very active in the Boys and Girls Committee. He coached many teams in our Baseball, Softball and Basketball programs. He had an envious ability of getting the most talent from each child and managed to create a fun environment at the same time. He was well respected by all his players and fellow coaches and those who coached against him.

In the early 1990's, his industry moved to Columbus. He had no choice but to move his business there and made the long weekly commute. He regretted that his involvement in

the Lions Club suffered, but he was still active in Youth Sports, and never missed "Festival Week" working tirelessly at the Ham and Blanket Wheel.

Dan was one of the founding fathers of Soccer in the Bellbrook/Sugarcreek area. For many years; in addition to his coaching in the Lions Club programs, he organized coached and refereed soccer through the S.A.Y program. He was one of several key individuals who cleared the way to have soccer become a Bellbrook High School Sport. As a Bellbrook Athletic Booster he worked diligently and would take on any project necessary to make Bellbrook Sports better. He was also a wonderful friend the Bellbrook/Sugarcreek Park District.

One year in late July we realized someone had stolen all of our soccer goal posts, and most likely cashed them in for scrap We were in a frantic situation with the season to begin in a few weeks. The soccer association hadn't been established long enough to have money to replace them, and the park district hadn't been born We went down to Dayton Metals and found enough pipe to build the goals we needed. Dan personally paid the entire bill.

Dan is survived by Debbie, his wonderful wife of 45 years, three sons, a daughter, their spouses, and nine grandchildren. Dan is now looking out for us from above, and his memory lives on with children playing sports and having fun with friendly competitions.
